Outstanding Programmatic Accomplishments:

Texas International 4-H Program

For over 30 years Dan served as the Texas International 4-H Program Coordinator. During his career, 131 youth from Texas participated in the International Foreign Youth Exchange (IFYE) program. These delegates lived with host families in 35 different countries. Over 800 families in Texas hosted IFYE delegates from other countries. These exchanges provided the opportunity for increased understanding and appreciation of cultural differences.

Greece Exchange Program

Since 2002, Dan has coordinated the American Farm School Program with Greece. The program allows Texas delegates the opportunity to learn about agricultural production around Athens. Also, youth and chaperones from Greece come to study agricultural production in Texas. This exchange has been beneficial to the 45 delegates that have participated.

Japanese Exchange Program

In the last 17 years, 500 Texas families hosted Japanese delegates and chaperones in their homes and they had the opportunity of learning about cultural differences. In the same time period more than 40 Texas delegates were selected and lived with host families in Japan. From 1998 until 2002 Dan served on the Board of Directors of the U.S. International Program Committee. This group oversees the program that involved over 1200 Japanese delegates to the United States and 250 delegates from the United States to Japan. Also, Dan served as Coordinator of the National High School Exchange Program that was responsible for the orientation and evaluation of some 100 high school students from Japan who spent one year attending high school in the United States. In 2001, due to the connections developed by Dan through these exchange programs, he was able to plan and develop an international study tour for Extension Professionals from Texas, Pennsylvania, and Illinois.

In 2006, after retiring from Extension, Dan established the Texas Global Education and Cultural Exchange and became the organizations Executive Director. This non-profit organization promotes global education through cultural exchange programs. The first group hosted by this organization was 25 Japanese delegates.

Other Exchange Programs

From 1985 until 2005, Dan worked with delegations from China, Egypt, Germany, Guatemala, Mexico, Poland, South Africa, Uganda, and Zambia to develop youth educational programs. One of the most recognized programs is "Hermanandonos", a 4-H Mexico Linkage Project which received funding from the Kellogg Foundation.

When you discuss International programs in Texas one of the first programs mentioned is the youth Extension program coordinated by Dan James.
