Mr. Potter as CEA-H has given over 240 oral presentations over the past 7 years. His clientele groups included: master gardeners; garden club & plant society members; Water Conservation boards; school groups; church groups; professional landscape, turf & irrigation associations; parks & recreation; county & municipal employees; botanical gardens & historical parks; HOAs & neighborhood associations; service clubs and Extension support groups, among others. Of Mr. Potter's 240+ talks, 38% related to insect identification & control as well as IPM, 28% related to landscape principles & practices including Xeriscaping, EarthKind and CEMAP, 15% related to spring & fall garden preparation relating to vegetables, fruits & herbs, 10% related to all aspects of disease identification & control, 5% related to water harvesting, conservation, & water quality, and 4% related to Extension outreach & careers in horticulture. Mr. Potter has facilitated a number of educational series' and conferences including master gardener & master naturalist trainings, turf grass conferences, landscape conferences, grounds maintenance seminars, native plant seminars, and aquaponics workshops. Mr. Potter has sought and received grants totaling \$56,200 in support of Extension-related activities.
