

- 2013 Pink Friday Dinner Tonight Healthy Cooking School-recruited volunteers, planned, marketed, implemented and evaluated the school that educated women on breast cancer awareness, healthy meal planning and preparation for their families and the importance of physical activity.
- **2013 Master Wellness Volunteer Program**-recruited volunteers, planned, marketed, secured funding and implemented the program. 16 volunteers completed the program and have completed over 500 hours of community service in Harris County.
- 2012-2013Urban Ag: From the Farm to the City Project- Coordinated the grant that targeted 4 Houston ISD elementary schools that increased 4-H enrollment, and exposed over 400 4th graders to agriculture and how it impacts the lives daily. Students participated in Egg to Chick, horticulture, food and nutrition projects and attended an Agricultural Awareness Day.
- 2012 TAE4HA 4-H Display developed a display that exhibited the diverse District 9 4-H programs.
- **2012 Texas Grow, Eat, Go Project** Member of the Harris County program implementation team. 3rd graders from 4 Klein ISD Title 1 schools participated in the project that encouraged healthy lifestyles through school gardens, educational food demonstrations and completion of the Walk Across Texas School Program.

The program empowered girls to make healthy life choices and taught communication skills that fostered healthy mother-daughter relationships.
